SECURITY ISSUES

You must understand before coming that under present circumstances, these rules take on unprecedented importance and a commitment to uncompromising compliance with them is a prerequisite for attending Midreshet Tehillah.

SHABBAT AND YOM TOV

Midreshet Tehillah is your home while you are away from home. We therefore recognize your needs as our responsibility. All meals are part of this, including *Shabbat* and *Yom Tov*. *Shabbat* and *Yom Tov*, however, are much more than food—they are opportunities to experience Torah in action. Therefore, Midreshet Tehillah has a number of school-wide *Shabbatonim* during the course of the year, which all students are required to attend. On those *Shabbatot* when we do **not** have a school program, you can set yourself up with friends and relatives for your Shabbat experience. If you do not have friends or relatives to go to, we will help you set yourself up with appropriate families in the neighborhood, including faculty members and families with which we have a relationship. If you are setting yourself up please be aware that due to the security situation, you may need special permission from your parents to visit friends or family in certain areas.
